## The source of The Village Chicago's strength and vibrancy is its members.

Despite the obstacles of the past year, the Village community continued to create new pathways for connection. Whether over the phone, in-person, or on Zoom, our members shared knowledge, compassion, and laughter.

In 2021, we conducted our fourth triennial Member Satisfaction Survey. The data show that we continue to deliver what people want most: being part of a community, enjoying events and activities, and meeting new and interesting people.



When asked what social issues are most important, the leading responses were isolation, diversity, and racial inequity. Our commitment to being an inclusive, equitable community will be reinforced with on-going education and training.

We are also accelerating our efforts by:

- Enrolling more Reduced Fee members
- Growing our LGBTQ+ community
- Making social events accessible to all
- Promoting age diversity through Ageless Innovators and the Bridging Generations Board
- Offering programs like the Racism Action Initiative and Turn the Page on Age

## TRAILBLAZERS AND MORE

The Village is a learning organization, and we place a high value on both recognizing and growing from the wisdom and example of others.

### The Village Chicago Annual Trailblazer Awards

These awards are given to individuals, organizations, and authors who have shown outstanding leadership in building an age-inclusive society. The Trailblazer Award recipients for 2021 were author and activist Ashton Applewhite; Co-Founder of Chicago Innovation, Tom Kuczmarski; and Chicago's first LGBTQ-friendly housing for older adults, Town Hall Apartments, developed with Heartland Alliance and Center on Halsted.

### Thought Leader Series

Throughout 2021, we invited individuals with special knowledge and expertise to

inspire and guide us including historians Dr. Carl Smith and Alexandra Dunietz; Physicians Drs. Cheryl Woodson, Lauren Gleason, Steven Fox; Neuroscientist Emily Rogalski, PhD; Second City and NBC writer and actor Mirage Thrums; entrepreneur Lou Reyes; ornithologist Josh Engel; author Shawn Shiflett; and others.

### Turn the Page on Age

We have learned that age bias impacts everyone, and that to dismantle it will require an expansion of the public's understanding of the relationship between age and ability. We are thrilled to launch an exciting awareness campaign called *Turn the Page on Age*, in partnership with Chicago Innovation, and with funding from RRF Foundation for Aging. Our goal is to rewrite the narrative on age and demonstrate that we can celebrate capabilities and achievements throughout life.

# Health AND WELLNESS

**“It’s more fun to get out for a walk when I can do it with others.”**

**Our Health and Wellness Program addresses all aspects of health — mental, social, and physical.** Programs are designed to help members and their families better understand and manage their health through careful attention to each person's unique situation and by providing best practice educational tools and connection to trusted resources.

In 2021, the Village offered 98 virtual and in-person health and wellness programs including Nutrition: Small Steps To Big Changes, A Legal Road Map to Aging Well, weekly exercise at home classes, Meditation Hour, weekly bike rides along

the lake and walks around the North Pond, Advance Care Planning, Medicare one-on-one counseling sessions, and many more.

As we continue to expand these programs, the goal remains the same — to help individuals and their families build upon their networks of support, and boost their confidence in making informed health care decisions.





# Brain Health AND MEMORY LOSS

As our Brain Health Memory Loss program grows, we are altering both the perception and the experience of living with memory loss. Gone are the isolation and stigma frequently experienced by care partners and their loved ones. Through the Village, the experience now encompasses community and family support, and programming that inspires hope and confidence:

- Personalized help and guidance
- Positive engagement through art, exercise, music, and social activities
- Empowerment and a sense of community through much needed peer support groups

We continue to reach out across disciplines to identify and implement best practices, and to expand our capacity, resources, and knowledge.

## Life 3.0

Our Life 3.0 Committee develops programs for the interests and needs of people 50-65 — whether that be caring for parents, continuing a career, finding a new one, volunteering — or just enjoying favorite pastimes.

## The Future of Work

This well-attended intergenerational program advanced the Village's goal of enabling all generations to work as the future is reinvented.

Several programs focused on the skills and strategies needed to navigate mid-life

career options. Others explored the impact of rapid and permanent change. Dr. Salma Ghanem, Provost of DePaul University, discussed the challenges facing higher education; Argonne Labs head of Science and Climate Research, Dr. Rao Kotamarthi, addressed climate change; and Dr. Rick Steven, also of Argonne Labs, described the impact of artificial intelligence.

## Volunteerism

Volunteerism at The Village Chicago soared to an all-time high during the pandemic. The community remains focused on helping others and sharing friendship, knowledge, and helping hands. In addition, many community members freely give their time and talent to the city's arts, cultural, youth, and service organizations.

## Ageless Innovators

Throughout 2021, the Ageless Innovators cross-generational mentoring program continued to attract innovators and leaders of all ages. Launched by the Village in 2019, in partnership with Chicago Innovation with generous grants from RRF Foundation for Aging, the program now has sent nearly 300 participants into their work settings armed with best practices for achieving age-inclusive workplaces.

We are continually expanding our relationships with people of all ages to enrich the Village community through employment, health, volunteerism, and social activities. Our Bridging Generations Board, Connectors, Allies and volunteers build meaningful connections and support networks that are truly diverse.

## Bridging Generations Board

The Bridging Generations Board (BGB) is a group of young people committed to building intergenerational connections within the Village community through volunteerism, lively programs, and



gatherings. Bolstered by the diverse experiences of Ageless Innovators, the BGB has developed popular events including a weekly short story discussion group, trivia nights, improv, and more.

In addition to these activities, the Village has brought the voices and insights of three young professionals onto our Board of Directors.



# SERVICES AND REFERRAL Network



**The pandemic did not stop the Village from delivering the same quality of services that have become its hallmark.**

In 2021, we filled 1,551 service requests including rides, referrals to member recommended professionals and tradespeople, help through a move, tech advice, and much more. We responded to requests as simple as a reliable plumber, to more complex needs such as an in-home companion with experience in dementia care, to help finding a second opinion prior to surgery.

Each individual received personal attention from our professional staff and nearly half of our service requests were fulfilled by volunteers. This value is at the very heart of the Village's purpose — to marshal the goodwill and skills of our community to sustain and help each other.

These organizations and businesses are an important part of the Village community. They provide ongoing support and collaboration and together, we are building a dynamic resource and voice for people over 50 in Chicago.

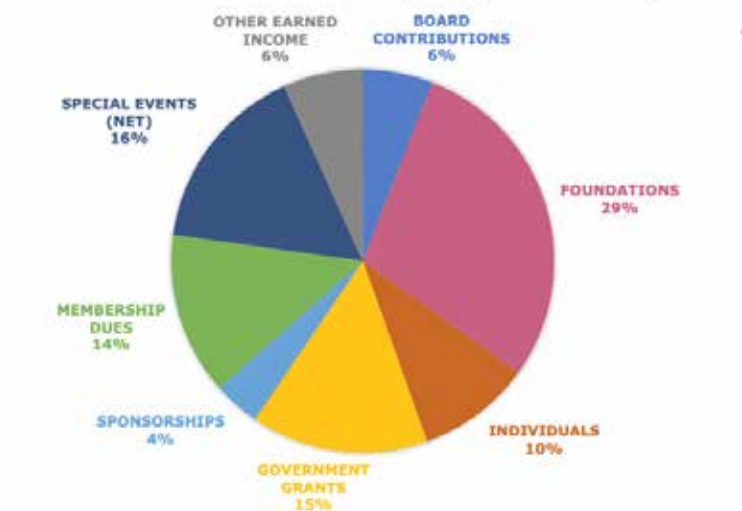

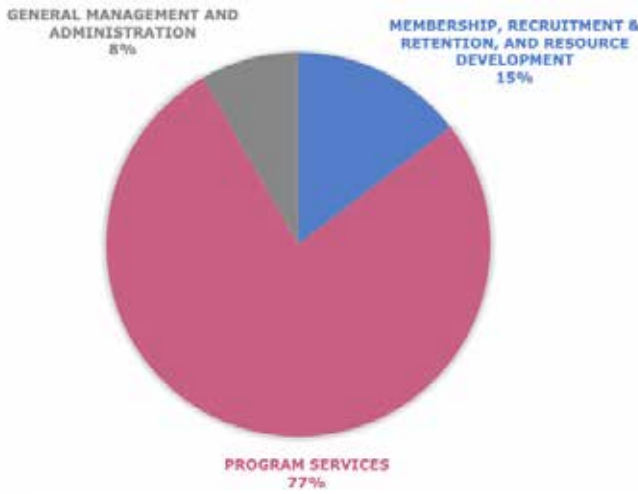

2021 REVENUE - \$956,290 (UNAUDITED)

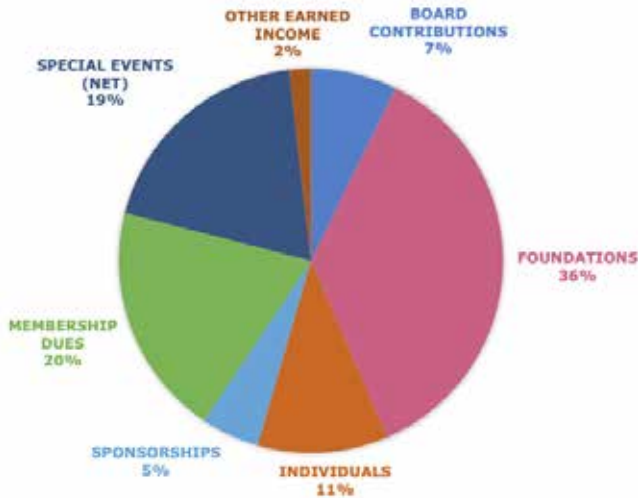


NET ASSETS AT BEGINNING OF 2021: \$766,535    NET ASSETS AT END OF 2021: \$1,114,158

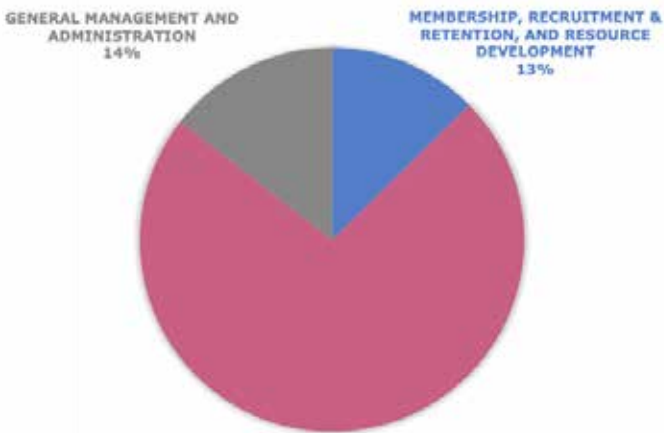
2021 EXPENSES - \$612,302 (UNAUDITED)
